## • PAPER:

- TRACING PAPER roll or pad. No smaller than 18" x 24" <u>http://www.dickblick.com/items/</u> <u>10624-1000/</u>.
  - PAPERS to choose from, depending on what medium you work in:
    - Watercolor paper: Hot press (smooth) or Cold press (textured) at least 140 pounds so it doesn't warp). You can buy a large sheet and cut it into the smaller sizes. 11"x14" min.
    - Illustration Board Cold Press Crescent works well for mixed media. Hot Press is good for ink because it is smoother in texture. 15" x 20" (My preference over Bristol paper)
       Toned or black mixed media paper (to work with gouache on top of a dark surface)
- **BRUSHES:** Soft bristles (Quality real hair or synthetic) Buy the best brush you can afford.
  - Cheap brushes aren't recommended, but are good for making textures.

- Brush sizes: 00 (round), 1 (round), 2 (round), 6 (round), 10 (flat - 1") size of brushes BRUSH BRANDS (or equivalent):

- Princeton Agua
- Princeton Neptune (round)
- Princeton Silver Black Velvet (round)
- Princeton Elite made to mimic a Kolinsky
- PAINTS:
  - **Gouache** Holbein Gouache Primary Mixing Kit (5 colors 20 ml tubes Approx: \$30), **OR** singular tubes of the Primary Colors of gouache by Holbien or Windsor Newton (I suggest buying the Holbein kit of gouache on Amazon.) **Note:** Acrylic gouache offers more flexibility than its traditional counterpart. You can overpaint in layers without worrying about smearing. As long as the layer is dry, you are free to add more paint. While it's still wet, though, it has the traits of watercolors. You can adjust, fix, remove, and reapply as needed.
    - <u>OPTIONAL CHOICE</u>: Instead of gouache, you can buy a Winsor Newton Cotman Watercolor Set <u>AND</u> 1 tube of white gouache (Daley-Rowney Designer Gouche (008 - Permanent White), or equivalent.
- INK & INK PENS (Waterproof):
  - Sakura 8 Pigma Mircon Set with Brush Black, or Faber-Castell PITT artist pens (Get various sizes to suit your needs.)
  - Bottle of India ink black, waterproof (Koh-I-Noor Drawing ink, Blick brand is fine, or equivalent)
    1 White Gel pen
- Colored Pencils Brands: Blick, Prismacolor, Faber-Castell, Derwent or equivalent
- Ruler (metal is suggested)
- 1 roll of white artist's tape removable
